School goals:

Every year, each school creates a plan to help focus on both academic and social development. This year we are really focusing on writing and for math each grade has a different key area of focus.

Writing goal: Classes are continuing to focus on writing and each classroom teacher has been using the results of the school wide write to pick the area they are focusing on first. We also have a group of students participating in a writing intervention program called “Expressive Writing”. This program is research based and specifically designed to help students who are struggling with written expression.

Helping at home: A fun activity to try in the car or around the supper table is “big deal or no big deal”. To start give a scenario such as “going camping in the winter”. Then each person decides whether this is a big deal (exciting) or not a big deal and explains their reasons for their choice. Reasons should all relate to the question and not go off topic. Students should list two or three ideas why it is a big deal or not a big deal. For example, if they chose camping in the winter is a big deal, their three ideas might be:

- A) Can do favourite activities such as ice fishing or sledding
- B) Can have campfires without worrying about a ban
- C) Less pests or predators e.g. mosquitoes, bears

Then, very importantly, students should elaborate on each idea with a reason. For example if one of their reasons was having a fire to stay warm then the supporting reason could be having a campfire in the winter can burn larger without worrying about the risk of a forest fire and they will be able to enjoy their favorite meal of campfire hot dogs.

Other possible topics might be having a winter activity day at school, having a movie night with friends, having pizza every day for a week or having school outside all day for one day.

Numeracy goal: This year we are focusing on ensuring students are able to compute percentages at grade 6, work with positive and negative numbers at grade 7, and use fractions to solve equations at grade 8. These concepts are absolutely critical to have mastered in order to have success at the next grade level.

Helping at home: The very best thing you can do to help your child succeed with math is to play lots of games that build fluency with math facts. We have just the opportunity for this! We are hosting a community wide family math night with internationally acclaimed presenters: John and Jane Felling from Box Cars and One Eyed Jacks!

Did you know that there is a province- wide tool for reporting concerns around student safety? Reports can be anonymous and will be followed up by the school principal. To access the ERASE reporting tool, go to the SMS website and it is the first selection under the "Students" tab at the top of the page.
