School goals:

Every year, each school creates a plan to help focus on both academic and social development. This year we are really focusing on writing and for math each grade has a different key area of focus.

Writing goal: We looked at some results for our students compared to similar grades across BC and it is evident that while our students are generally very strong readers, they are finding writing much more difficult. We will be doing a "School Wide Write" during the month of November and teachers will look at the results to find areas of strength for their class, as well as specific areas they will focus on to help students move ahead with their writing.

Helping at home: One thing that kids are really struggling with is coming up with more than one thing to say that answers a question. Something you can do at home to help with this is ask a daily/weekly "Would You Rather" question. Have your child give you three reasons, out loud, to support their choice. For example: "Would you rather have only summer or only winter weather?" Answer: I would like to have only summer weather because the mornings are cool enough to go outside to run and the then the afternoons are warm enough for the beach; the warm weather means my heating bills are lower and the sunshine and warmth mean my garden produces healthy food for my family. Having your child formulate reasons orally is great practice. You don't have to be writing everything down in order to build writing skills.

Numeracy goal: This year we are focusing on ensuring students are able to compute percentages at grade 6, work with positive and negative numbers at grade 7, and use fractions to solve equations at grade 8. These concepts are absolutely critical to have mastered in order to have success at the next grade level.

<u>Helping at home:</u> playing games to ensure students are fluent with their basic addition and multiplication facts will go a long way towards success. One of the best math games is Yahtzee. You need only 5 regular dice, a game sheet and a piece of paper.

Player 1 rolls all 5 dice. You have 3 rolls and can roll as many of the dice for each roll as you want. At the end of the three rolls you must choose the category you are counting your rolls towards and fill in the box.

Upper section:

Aces: count all the 1's on your 5 dice Twos: count all the 2's on your 5 dice

Etc.

If the total of the upper section is 63 or more, you get a 35 point bonus.

Lower section:

3 of a kind: must have 3 of the same #; add total of all 4 of a kind: must have 4 of same #; add total of all dice Full house: 3 of one # and 2 of the other scores 25 pts Small straight: sequence of 4 numbers e.g. 2,3,4,5, Large straight: all five dice in a sequence e.g. 1,2,3,4,5 Yahtzee: 5 of a kind (can use all 3 rolls to get this) Chance: sum of all dice

The highest total wins the game.

The last pro D was a provincial pro D day, which means that provincial specialist associations run conferences that many of our teachers attended. For example, some teachers attended a conference about using technology effectively in the classroom, or teaching French Immersion. Other teachers learned more about current research into literacy instruction, teaching phonics in middle years, critical thinking skills and promising practices in math instruction. Our professional development days are super important to us as it gives us a chance to stay current with the latest research into helping our kids have the skills to excel in our ever-changing world.
